Leadership

I am passionate about learning from others, continuing education and sharing what I have learned in creative and innovative ways. Listening, learning and teaching are skills that are crucial to leadership in our Diocese.

I am skilled at raising up new leaders in the church, mentoring colleagues in supportive team ministry and taking on leadership roles in our Diocese and at the Provincial and National levels.

A pastoral, listening presence is one of my strengths. In addition, I have training in conflict mediation, complex grief situations, palliative care response and suicide prevention.

While still in university and continuing to this day, I have supported students in theological studies through mentorship, summer and in-year internships, as an archdeacon and now as a leader in Fresh Start. I am part of a team creating a clergy check-in to facilitate communication and support for clergy. Setting boundaries around time serving and time for rest, asking what supports are needed for the increasingly complex parish situations we face – are all part of this ‘check-in’ approach. Supporting parishes through listening and addressing the needs of the laity in our parishes is vital as we move into a new expression of the Anglican church – reviewing and adapting old models of parish service and operation to meet the current needs and look forward to a thriving future. Continuing the work on the Shape of Parish Ministry, evaluating and refining this collaborative plan, has us moving ahead of the changes that are happening in our communities and our church.

I have a gift for administrative details and finding efficiencies in church administration, structure, and financial operations. I am experienced in leading stewardship campaigns and have gleaned many creative ideas from the various parishes in which I have served.

Social Justice: These issues are the heart of my call to serve as a Christian and in my call to ordination. Our Community Ministries are integral to our identity as the Anglican Diocese of Ottawa. Homelessness, Human Trafficking, Street Youth Issues, Food Justice, and Reconciliation with Indigenous Peoples are particular areas I have experience in serving.

Continuing Professional and Spiritual Development:

I continue to attend workshops and conferences online, honing different skills and developing awareness, e.g. Online Worship – liturgy and music in a time of pandemic – hybrid vs. observation, Festival of Homiletics. A variety of sessions on Homelessness and was a presenter at both Ottawa and Toronto Forums on Homelessness. Human Trafficking in Ontario, Anti-Racism (2021, 2023), Addressing the Declining Numbers in Congregations and the Leading Women Conference (Anglican and Episcopal Churches).

I completed the School for Parish Development in Vancouver over a two-year period and developed many skills. These include the ability to create a detailed survey and assessment of a parish. This led to the collaborative development of Strategic Directions which reflect the engaged heart of a parish as it looks to the future.
